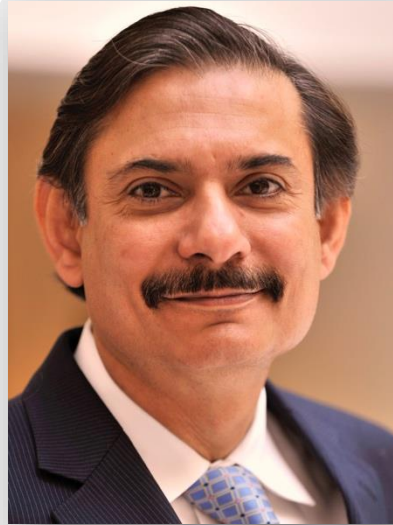

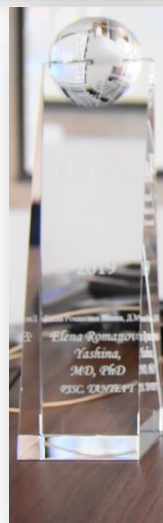

"Bill Bunn is like a force of nature," said Sean Sullivan, President & CEO of IHPM – "an indefatigable practitioner of what he preaches – that productivity is the ultimate value for employers from investing in the health of their work force. 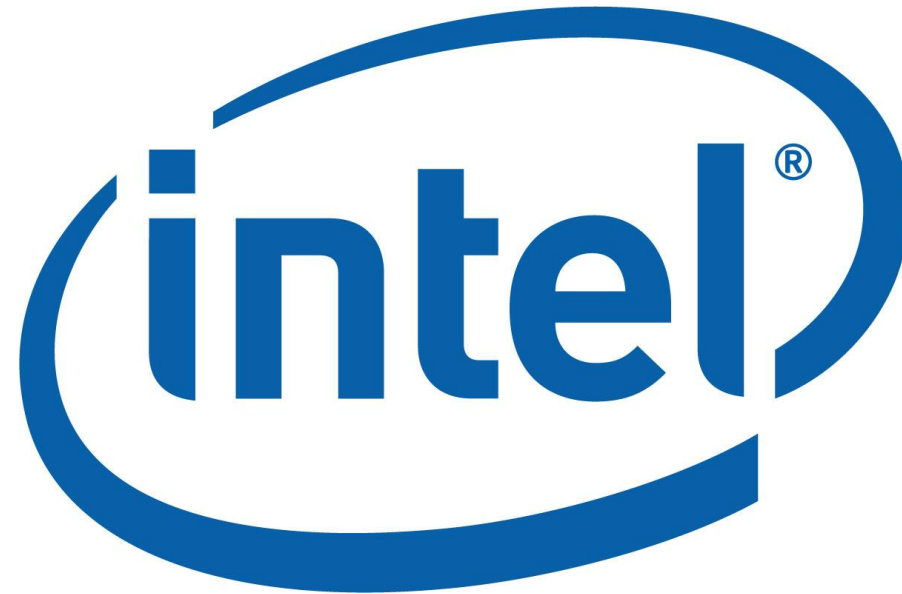

Dr. Debra Lerner Honored for Leadership || BY INSTITUTE FOR HEALTH AND PRODUCTIVITY MANAGEMENT

Receives IHPM's President's Award for Leadership in Advancing the Field of Health and Productivity Management

Scottsdale, Arizona, October 15, 2008 – At its 8th Annual International Conference today, the **Institute for Health and Productivity Management (IHPM)** gave its President's Award for Outstanding Leadership in Health and Productivity Measurement to **Debra Lerner, PhD**, *Director of the Program on Health, Work and Productivity and Associate Professor at Tufts School of Medicine*.

This marks the first time the Award has been given to an individual rather than an organization (previous winners include Aetna and Mayo Clinic Health Solutions) -- indicating the importance of Dr. Lerner's contribution to advancing health and productivity management as a business strategy for maximizing the value of employees' health to corporate performance

"It was the greatest business thinker of the past century, Peter Drucker, who stated famously that 'you can't manage what you can't measure,'" observed IHPM President and CEO Sean Sullivan, in presenting the Award to Dr. Lerner. "In that regard, Debra Lerner's contribution to the field of Health and Productivity Management is, itself, immeasurable. The advance of this field from a standing start when IHPM was founded in 1997 is due in no small part to the work of Debra Lerner and her fellow scientists, who developed the survey tools that have made the impact of health on productivity provable to skeptical business decision makers."

Dr. Lerner and her colleagues at Tufts developed the Work Limitations Questionnaire (WLQ), regarded by many as the best tool available for quantifying the impact of health problems on the functional capacity to meet the various demands of a job – physical, mental, and psychosocial – and then measuring the positive impact of interventions to improve that capacity and translate it into better productivity. "*The WLQ is used by IHPM in our own extensive field research projects with employers*," said Sullivan; "*it is key to building a business case that investing in health will reduce total health-related costs, the largest part of which for most employers in the dominant knowledge-work economy results from impaired performance in the workplace.*"

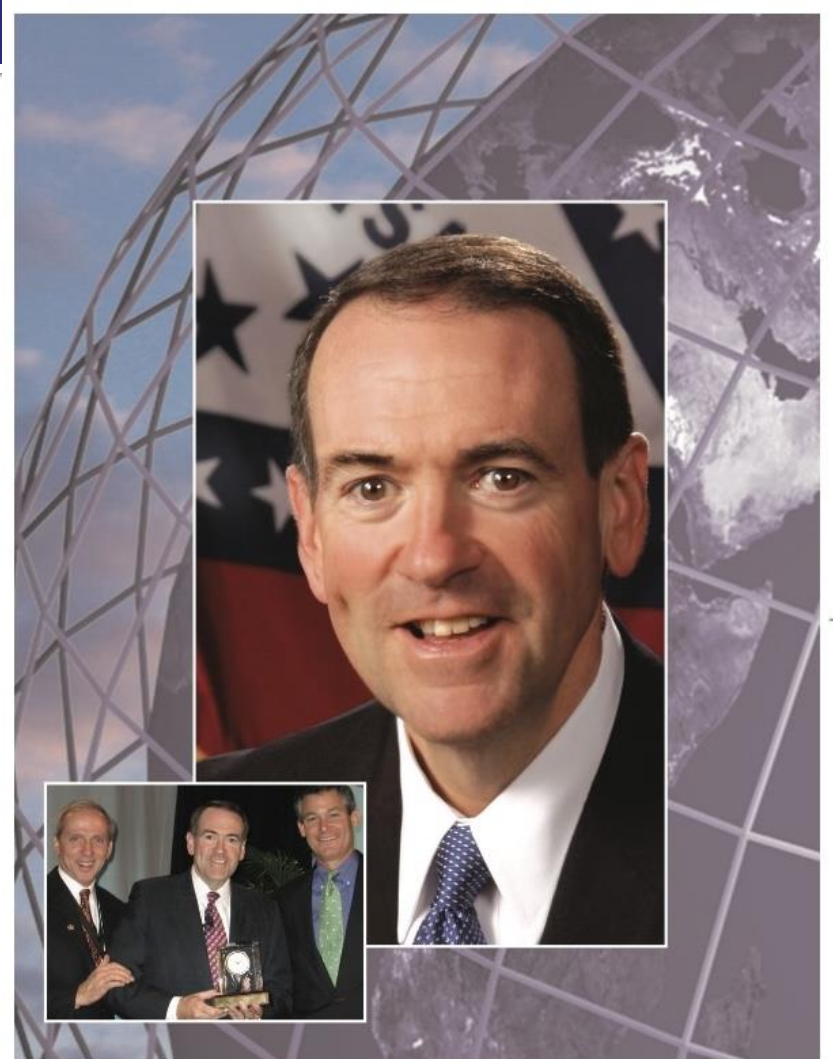

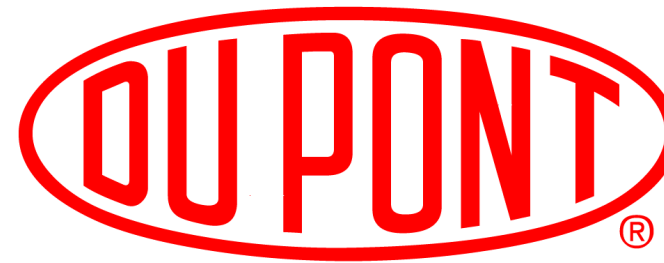
CEO Award For Leadership in Advancing Health and Productivity as a Business Development Strategy for a State

Mike Huckabee implemented the Healthy Arkansas initiative, a comprehensive effort defining specific areas where behavioral changes can lead to healthier individuals. Tobacco use, obesity and lack of physical activity are the primary causes of such serious chronic conditions as diabetes, stroke, lung and heart diseases and cancer. The Healthy Arkansas initiative provides strategies to reduce or eliminate the behavior-related causes of these diseases. "People put money and energy into treating disease and illness rather than dealing with avoiding disease through healthier lifestyles," Huckabee tells us. "We have staggering rates of heart attacks, high blood pressure and strokes simply because people opt not to take care of themselves." Mike Huckabee's leadership in setting up these programs to improve the health of the residents of Arkansas was driven by his personal recognition of the physical and costly detriment of poor health. Hear the real-life experience of Huckabee on how he changed his life based on a focus to get healthy and used this motivation combined with his position of authority and leadership to effect health policy changes for the State of Arkansas. "It's about making a life change not losing weight" – and Mike Huckabee set his goal "to regain his health."

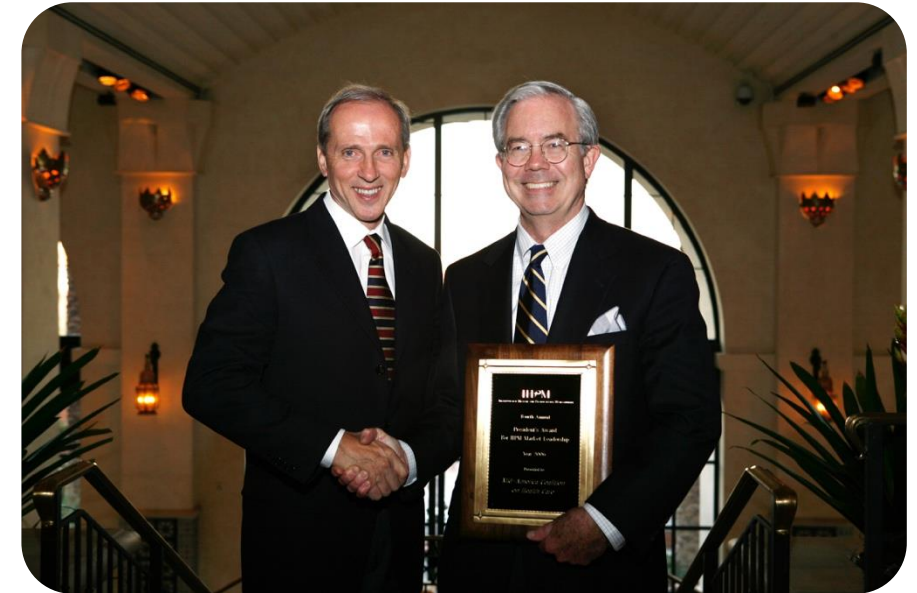
2006 | President's Award Mid-America Coalition on Health Care

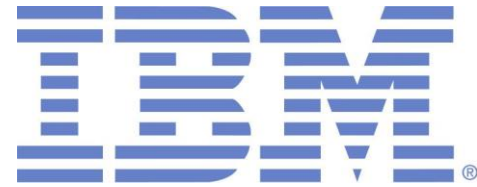
Aetna Receives President's Award From the Institute for Health and Productivity Management (IHPM)

John R. Horne | President & COO, Navistar International Receives CEO's Award from Institute for Health and Productivity Management

After receiving a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from Purdue in 1960, Mr. Horne went on to obtain a master's degree from Bradley University in 1964. He also is a graduate of Harvard's Program for Management Development. Mr. Horne started his career with Caterpillar Tractor Company as an engineer. He joined Navistar's (then International Harvester) engine engineering department in 1966. From 1970 - 1983 he was promoted through that division, holding positions such as Chief Engineer for Advanced Engine Design, Divisional Chief Engineer for Engine Research and Development, and Vice President for Engine Engineering. In 1983, Mr. Horne was appointed Corporate VP & General Manager of Navistar's Engine and Foundry Group. He was elected to his current position, President and Chief Operating Officer of Navistar, in 1990. He also serves on the company's board of directors.

•"I'd like to see the combination of industry, students, and universities working harder to change the way U.S. industry competes in the world. Many engineers become pure technical experts. Our nation needs technical experts, but it also needs engineers who apply their technical skills and education to the broad business aspects of being competitive on a world-class basis." His advice is to: *"Define problems, define facts, define the environment and boundary conditions before jumping to conclusions. That applies to all life, particularly to business. Too many people in business have the solution before they define the problem."*

It is clear from Mr. Horne's way of approaching work and life that he is a true leader. Having applied that thinking in his leadership at Navistar, it is clear why IHPM has chosen Mr. Horne to receive its first CEO Award" says Sean Sullivan, JD, CEO of the Institute.
